AYERCO SCHOOL FUNDRAISER

Ayerco is again electing to partner with Pittsfield High School for a fundraiser. Ayerco will generously donate 25 cents per unit sold to PHS. Sales will be on a 24 oz. and any CSD or alternative beverage drink in the cold vault. The fundraiser will begin on October 1, 2018, and conclude on December 31, 2018. Proceeds will be directed toward the PHS weight room. PHS is grateful to have Ayerco as a partner.

WEIGHT ROOM REDO

Last spring the coaches began working under the supervision of Mr. Tomhave to develop a listing of equipment that needed to be in the weight room. The coaches narrowed the list to the necessary equipment that would meet the needs of all of our athletes. The project has been made possible through a variety of sources. The Class of 1954 generously supplied \$10,000. The Saukee Loyalty funds from FSB and UCB contributed \$1,000 each. The revamping of our sports programs allowed \$3,000 to be utilized for the weight room. The initial purchase of equipment was approximately \$14,300.00 To complete the weight room it will take another \$6,000 which would allow the purchase of 4

more power racks. In the past week, our athletes staffed a McAthlete night, and the Ron Tomhave Memorial fund contributed a total of \$2,000, so one more power rack is on its way.

A tremendous amount of gratitude to Steve Smith and his crew for volunteering to paint the weight room.

FFA

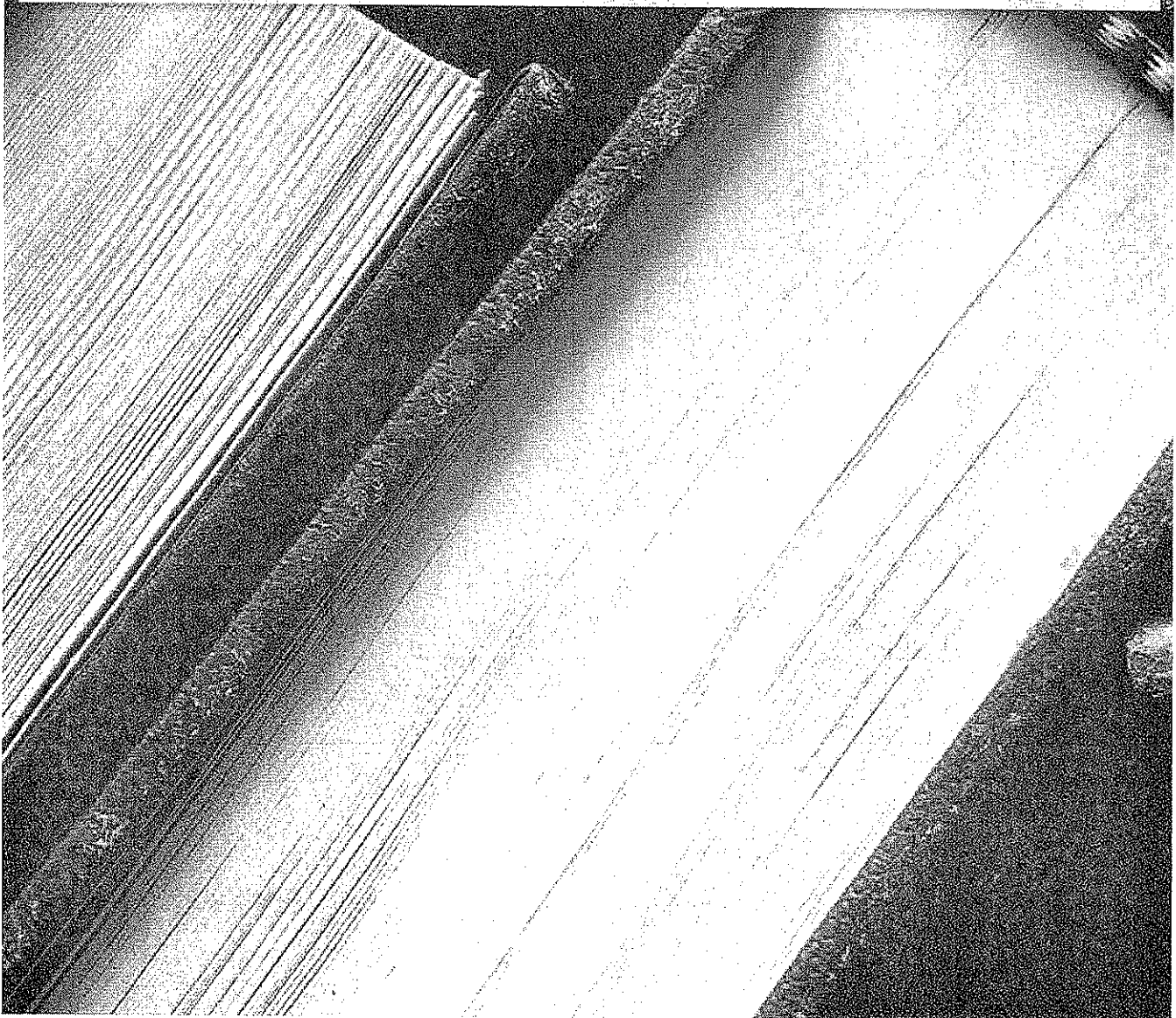
